Building work is on track at the Port Pirie Uni Hub campus.

The front of the campus has already been freshened up with a new coat of paint and work inside is well underway.

The site is being renovated to include a range of study spaces, as well as exam and meeting rooms, student kitchen and lounge facilities and administration support space.

There is also a multifunction space which will be used for exams, and is available for hire for functions such as conferences.

The building will host video conferencing facilities and computer, printer and high-speed internet access. To support this the building is being fully rewired to ensure the electrical and data/wifi requirements of the hub are met.

New airconditioning systems will also be installed this month as well as a swipe card system for the security of staff and students.



Uni Hub works officially launched

Work is well underway at Uni Hub Spencer Gulf's Port Pirie campus at the old library on Ellen Street.

Building works were officially launched recently by Federal Member for Grey MP Rowan Ramsey, who said the federal government's decision to back the study hub would provide unprecedented access for country students to study closer to home and slash the cost of tertiary access.

Port Augusta Mayor Brett Benbow said the demand for higher education had been ris-

ing in regional areas, and the hub was set to directly service the educational needs of an estimated 680 people.

Port Pirie Mayor Leon Stephens said students who opt to study through Uni Hub Spencer Gulf would experience a whole new level of support.
